The DNR says, "Don't Feed the Deer!"

Freeborn County is one of the counties in MN affected by the Deer Feeding Ban. Feeding and attractant bans are in place across the state to prevent concentrations of wild deer in areas with higher risk of disease. According to the DNR, bird feeders need to be at least 6 feet above ground level. Not only will this allow deer to stay in their natural habitat but our gardens, flowers, yards and shrubs will sure appreciate it!
